Dear Parents.

Emotional intelligence is just as important as their academic success; it enables pupils to have positive interactions with others, to anticipate their feelings and to experience appropriate levels of empathy. form of teaching, early experiences and education can help our pupils master the fine art of relating to other people! Our PSHE lessons are very much part of this, and this week, was reinforced during Anti -Bullying Week. On Monday, we all wore odd socks to mark the start of this special week to encourage people to express themselves and celebrate their individuality and what makes us all unique! Mrs Rudge led our Anti-Bullying assembly where there was a clear and positive message that bullying is neither acceptable nor inevitable in our school community. The theme of the week was 'Reach Out' which aimed to encourage children to speak out about bullying. Whether this is speaking out to a trusted adult or reaching out to another person who is being bullied; if we can

challenge bullying we can change it.

This evening, the BBC will host their annual Children in Need event. I spoke to the children in assembly about the important work this charity does and how we can help. Tonight on TV, the BBC will host 'The Great SPOTacular Appeal' where everyone is being encouraged to be SPOTacular with lots of fun ways to raise money. This might mean baking spotty cupcakes, wearing a spotty outfit, painting spots on your nails, or putting your skills to the test with a fun on-the-spot challenge. In school, we have been thinking about charities and events we can hold; however, it may be that your child feels inspired to do something independently to support children less fortunate than themselves, as all children deserve a healthy, happy life. If they do, please let me know.

Our Parent Social is this afternoon, and by the time this newsletter is sent out, I hope there will be parents in school, enjoying socialising with each other, and viewing our new Library and trim-trail on the Prep playground. I hope you like the new spaces as much as your children do, and I want to thank the SCA, and you, as the parent body, for your fundraising efforts to allow these improvements to happen.

Finally, after watching a little of the Pre-Prep rehearsing the Nativity, this week, I have been giving some thought to our upcoming Christmas festivities (it's never too early to start getting excited about Christmas!). Our Christmas tree is due

to arrive next week (along with a new garland for the staircase!) and, this year, we will continue the tradition we started last year where all the pupils were involved in decorating the tree, to mark the start of the Christmas season. 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Weekly E-Safety Tip:

Six ways to make YouTube safer to use for children, from the NSPCC.

Safety settings and features on YouTube

Supervised Experience

A supervised experience YouTube account is available for under 13s with a Google account managed by Family Link. This can help manage how they use the app.

This will give you access to content settings and parental controls to help you manage what channels they can subscribe to and how long they spend on the app.

Restricted Mode

This helps to filter out inappropriate videos. However, it's not 100% effective due to the volume of videos on the platform. To enable this feature go to 'Settings'. Click the drop down menu at the bottom of the screen and select 'Restricted Mode: Off'. Change the option to 'On' and press 'Save'.

Custom password

You can set up a custom passcode to stop your child from accessing your parental controls and making changes. To do this, tap the lock icon, and choose 'Set my own passcode'.

Set videos to private

If your child posts their own videos on YouTube you might want to speak to them about setting the content they upload to private so only their subscribers or followers can view their videos. Remem-

ber to talk to your child about who is allowed to follow or subscribe to their channel.

To do this you need to go to 'Library' and select 'Your Videos'. Then select 'More' and 'Visibility'. You can then choose from the following options:

Public – everyone, including those who don't have a YouTube account, can see the video.

Private – only subscribers can watch.

Unlisted – this makes the video private so no one can see it unless they have a direct link to the clip.

Auto-play

Auto-play stops videos from automatically playing after one has ended. This will stop your child from watching videos suggested to them by the app.

To turn this on, go to the watch screen on any video. Then tap the auto-play switch so it says 'Off'.

Create playlists

You can create playlists on YouTube to help manage the videos your child can watch. We recommend watching videos before your child does to make sure they're appropriate and then adding them to a new playlist. To add a video to a playlist select 'Save' at the bottom of the video you want to add. Select the playlist you want to add it to or choose 'create new playlist'.
