Lego (Prep)

Street Art (Prep)

At the beginning of this half-term, we welcomed a new group of excited children to our popular Street Art Club. They began by learning about the difference between graffiti and street art and looked at examples of some famous artists such as Banksy, Blek le Rat and Keith Haring. They were then set the challenge of coming up with their own bold and unique 'tag' that was something personal to thema few of their examples included Kaotic, Tanix, Chips and Biscuit. Using the tracing paper tech-

nique, they transferred their tags to their folders and also experimented with improving their designs by using lettering from online graffiti websites. The children then explored some pieces of work from the prolific street artist Invader and created an 'Invader-style' design of their own. Here are some of the comments made by the children about what they have enjoyed so far:

Digby Harman (6C): "I like Street Art Club because I enjoy looking at different styles of Art. In today's lesson, I explored different fonts online and traced over the ones that I liked the best to improve the styling of my own tag.

Charles Doble (5L): "I really enjoyed creating my tag using the tracing paper, and I also liked using the website Graffiti Empire to look at different lettering.

Isaac Smith (4MD): It's been really fun to design our own tags because we've been able to choose our own lettering and colour our tags using Mr Chowdhury's cool pens!

Melody Lindsey (6C): "I like Street Art Club because it's so creative and it's generally really fun!"
