Our final week of this term has been as busy as ever!

This week, we launched our Parent Partnership Education with two separate events. At St Christopher's, we love sharing school life with you, and I hope you do feel there is much

to engage with. We recognise that parents have a significant role in pupils' academic success, and parental involvement in education is key to this. Research has indicated that parental or family involvement in a child's education is a more accurate predictor of pupil achievement than social status or family income. With this in mind, we want to make sure that we align the messages teachers and parents are giving to our pupils, which is why we will always strive to have you involved in all that we do, and make sure our messaging about what we provide is clear.

On Monday, Miss Rule and I enjoyed talking to our Year 5 parents about Secondary School Transfer, and how to navigate this in the coming year. I hope this was helpful, especially since we also had current Year 6 parents on hand to provide their wisdom having just negotiated

it themselves! Thursday was our first curriculum talk, and these will now continue over the course of each academic year with various subject areas being in the spotlight. Mrs Rudge gave an excellent outline of our PSHE curriculum, which includes Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) in school. This is a compulsory part of our curriculum, with the aim to teach children about positive interactions with others, healthy relationships, how to value themselves and others and how to be safe and happy in relationships. Again, I hope this was helpful to get to know how and what we teach in school. Thank you to Mrs Rudge for her time preparing and delivering this. Both presentations will shortly feature in the 'Parent Education Partnership' section of the website (one in academic, and one in the pastoral section).

There was further parental involvement on Wednesday, with the Year 3 and 4 Music and Drama Showcase. I think the Performing Arts not only play a hugely significant role in helping children to develop their creative skills, but also are all about self expression, exploring alternative options and embracing individuality. The fact that they are not black and white, or about right or

wrong answers, allows children to develop self confidence and belief in themselves which is why these productions are so important. I loved the variety of talent we got to experience at the showcase and I especially LOVED listening to the debut of the Jack and the Beanstalk radio broadcast. Thank you to Mrs Gay and Miss Wooderson for their skill and expertise in creating such a novel performance for parents to enjoy.

I was delighted to see so many creative fashion statements coming into school today in preparation for the Easter Hatwalk later. My hat from last year has had a makeover, and is now ready for its debut appearance on the catwalk. I look forward to seeing you all for what is now fast becoming a favourite in our school calendar for staff, pupils and parents!




#### **Emailing teachers**

#### E-safety tip

One highly controversial question, heard earlier and earlier in school years by parents is "When can I get a phone?" While there is no one answer to fit everyone, there are a range of strategies that may work for individual situations



and needs. These range from gaming-only hand -me-downs without communication abilities to fully functional smartphones. Each has its own pitfalls and bonuses.

In research in 2022, Ofcom found that technology use across the UK showed that **nearly all** 13 – 15 year olds (98%) have their own phone. For most of these young people, they were given their phones around the start of secondary school, between the ages of 9 and 11 (91%). However, as educators we see this tideline being pushed back further and further, and with it, the associated risks.

This <u>link</u> will take you to a UK Safer Internet Centre article with different strategies being shared and outcomes discussed. There are some creative solutions to the phone pester power. Also there is a further link to a "First Phone Checklist", starting conversations about online safety and secondary transitions with technology, all published by Childnet.
