Dear Parents,

We started our week, on Tuesday, with a celebration of the incredible work of the nursing profession and the difference these people make to people's lives, in preparation for International Nurses Day which is celebrated around the world every year

on 12th May: the anniversary of Florence Nightingale's birth. Mrs Mantel led the assembly, and talked about her time as a nurse, and how there is one thing all nursing staff have in common – their unwavering commitment to changing people's lives for the better, and not just their patients' lives, but the lives of their patients' families and loved ones too. We all enjoyed seeing some of our pupils dressed as nurses, as they role-played helping a patient. It also gave us an opportunity to challenge the gender stereotypes still held by young people, as discovered by a recent NHS study, that men are doctors and women are nurses. It was interesting that this idea also came up in our assembly by a few pupils! It is so important that we work in school to confront these gender stereotypes formed in our early years, as they often continue to influence our children's career considerations and decisions in later life. We want the pupils here to become whatever they want to be, and not be shackled to a generalised view or preconception about the roles that are, or should be, performed by men and women.

I hope you enjoyed the Bank Holiday weekend, and perhaps enjoyed some celebrations over the Coronation. As part of this historic event, Britons were encouraged to volunteer in their communities during the Coronation weekend as part of a "national day of volunteering". You may know that the event, called the 'Big Help Out', was launched in a bid to turn around declining numbers of volunteers nationwide which hit record lows last year. This has inspired us in school and, as part of our 130th School Birthday celebrations, we will be launching our own initiative called "St Christopher's in the Community". We are very excited about this, and we hope our pupils and families In the community will be too (more on the birthday event, and this initiative below).

Linked to this hope to engage in more charity work as a school, we hosted our first event working alongside the charity Re-engage, on Friday This is a charity who work with older people who are feeling alone or isolated. We hosted a small tea party for 6 guests where some of our pupils performed and chatted to them. We hope this event helped to bring a little joy and laughter into our guest lives. Over the coming year, we hope to be able to do a little more of this in school, as well as encourage our pupils to seek out opportunities independently to help out within their own community.

We had two year groups out this week on their residential trips: Year 4 left on Tuesday for four days at Rockley Point, in Poole, and Year 4 departed on Wednesday to Grosvenor Hall, in Ashford. I enjoyed popping in for the day, on Thursday, to see Year 4, despite arriving in a hailstorm! I was put to the test on the 3G Swing with Mrs West (and apparently there is a very funny video of our descent too!) It was great to see the pupils out of a classroom environment, and I enjoyed watching them overcome challenges and achieve things that they did not think possible. I hope they have all returned with a large confidence boost that they can take into other areas of their life and learning, not to mention great memories.

•Planting flowers/plants in the local community gardens (support from council)

We hope, as well as hosting events within school including opportunities within our ECHO time, that pupils and their families will want to look for opportunities to help out and then share these with the School, in the same way we currently hear about pupil successes. the children about the future. 
