Thank you for your continued support and trust in our school community. Let's make this final half-term before the summer holidays an unforget-table one, as we look forward to celebrating the events together.



Micah 5R - "My favourite activity was kayaking because we got to learn how to capsize safely which was challenging but hilarious!"


Felix 5L - "I really enjoyed the rock climbing and high ropes because we got to climb different, challenging routes and tackle a range of tricky obstacles.

E-safety tip

In this week's E-Safety segment, we are re-visiting a resource used by Reception during Safer Internet Day. This story, called Hanni and the Magic Window, is an ex-



cellent resource for children of Key Stage One and Two. For children, the story tackles how to react when things go wrong online, what that might feel like and how a trusted adult can help. For parents and carers, it will cover how to open up a conversation with a child when you notice their behaviour has changed or they have seen something that is bothering them but don't know how to open up. Our reception classes drew amazing pictures of what they would like to see out of the window.
