
Weekly news at St Christopher's

<u>ECHO</u>

A new school year and a new Wednesday afternoon ECHO Club: STEM Challenge Club with Mr Chowdhury and Mr Myatt.

The children began this first session by discussing what STEM was and how it impacts and affects our day-to-day lives. They talked about careers which use STEM and we came to the conclusion that STEM is present in all our lives, whether it is as scientists, engineers, architects, doctors, nurses and even as TV entertainers. The children came up with a brilliant list of what skills we develop when we use STEM, including: accuracy, mathematics, measuring and communication. Then the first week's challenge began!

The children were tasked with creating a selfsupporting dome using straws and sellotape. Many structures are built around frameworks made of straight, rigid pieces of wood or metal, called members, connected together. Forces generated in the members support the structure. They had only forty five minutes to work collaboratively to make their structures that would be marked according to their appearance, strength (which would be tested at the end) and how well they worked in their teams.

As time got away from us, we agreed to extend this week's activity to continue next week and we would find out who the next SCTH Isambard Kingdom Brunel is. If you would like to have a go at this activity, the resources and instructions can

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


<u>Music</u>
