		<p>Unit 2: im- words starting with m or p Forming antonyms (opposites) immature immortal immobile impossible impatient impolite</p> <p>Note: The meaning of these words can be enhanced by adding the suffix -ly immaturity impolitely impatiently</p>

		<p>Unit 3: suffix -ous dangerous poisonous mountainous famous hazardous</p> <p>Root words ending in e: drop the e, then add -ous famous</p> <p>Note: There are exceptions where there is no root word: enormous tremendous jealous fabulous</p>

		<p>Consolidation 2 Recap spelling patterns and rules from Unit 3 and Unit 4</p>
		<p>Unit 5: words ending in -ture (chuh sound) Adventure picture capture temperature furniture future creature nature mixture</p> <p>Note: Some words end with the chuh sound but are not spelt with -ture catcher teacher richer preacher</p>
		<p>Unit 6: adding -ation to verbs to form nouns Changing verbs into nouns</p> <p>Verbs ending with a consonant limitation admiration ventilation temptation adoration information</p> <p>Verbs ending in e: drop the e before adding -ation sensation admiration preparation</p> <p>Note: Some words contain -ation as part of the root word and not as a suffix station nation</p>
