She shared the importance of investing time and effort to learn and grow while emphasising the profound impact of small acts of kindness in charitable work. Hearing from parents like Mrs. Powar who are actively involved in charity work serves as an invaluable example for our St. Christopher's in the Community initiative. Additionally, on Wednesday, we celebrated our first "No Pen Day." This day encouraged students to put down their pencils and focus on honing their speaking and understanding skills. It's a fantastic opportunity for us as educators to think more creatively about how we deliver our lessons and foster a more engaging learning environment.

Last term, in my newsletter, I mentioned the recent Labour Party proposal regarding private school fees, and there is now a parent-initiated petition that may interest you. This petition, started by a working family with a child in a private school, addresses Labour's pledge to end the tax-exempt status of education, potentially adding VAT to

private school fees. We recognise that private schools cater to a diverse range of pupils, with families often making significant sacrifices to choose specific schools. Labour's proposal has the potential to displace many families, compelling them to transfer their children to already overcrowded state schools. This will not only burden state schools and local authorities, but it may also increase the financial strain on parents who currently pay school fees in addition to contributing to school funding through taxes. The petition calls for support to urge Labour to reconsider their proposal of introducing VAT on school fees and to recognise the value of private schools. The goal is to encourage Labour to formulate an education policy that benefits all children, rather than imposing financial challenges on working families who have chosen private education. It's an opportunity for concerned parents to make their voices heard and advocate for the preservation of educational choices that best suit their children's needs. You can access the petition here.

Finally, as we embark on this new term, we'd like to provide a few gentle reminders:

- Healthy Snacks: Please ensure your children bring in a healthy snack for their break time.
 We are not going to stipulate what should be brought in and what can't be brought in, but we encourage nutritious options, and kindly request that pupils do not bring things like chocolate or packets of crisps as a snack.
- Winter Uniform: Students should be in their winter uniform, which should be clearly named. Additionally, please ensure that your child wears proper school shoes rather than trainers unless they are dressed in PE kit on days when they have Games/PE.
- Hair Ties: Hair ties should be in the school colour to maintain a uniform and tidy appearance.






Maths Parent Partnership Evening

Please do help us support this very worthy cause where possible. Thank you in advance for supporting this extremely worthwhile cause.




Preschool

E-safety tip

This week's E-Safety message focuses on using technology and looking at online safety positively. The NSPCC has



created six tips for keeping things positive when children are exploring the online world.

- 1. Screen Time: Be aware of exactly how much time is being spent online. Use the built in wellbeing settings on apps like Instagram and TikTok.
- 2. Enable children by showing them how to block accounts, words or phrases that they do not want to see. Navigate the negative.
- 3. Is it fake? Encourage children to challenge what they see online and to know if a source is trusted.
- 4. Keep positive. Mistakes can and will happen. Use them as a learning opportunity to enable and protect in the future.
- 5. Lead. Take the initiative to model positive examples like screen time, content access and lead by example.
- 6. Talk. Don't forget to talk about the positives of being online as much as the negatives, and really listen to what they're telling you.
