and the enthusiasm infectious. I cannot wait for a term full of exploring the enchanting world of Disney!



The first lesson consisted of using historical sources to find out about the Victorian period, with lots of discussion and group work. We inspected a variety of paintings, to discuss and imagine what life was like during the Victorian times. This links with our new artist, William Morris, whose focus was on repeated patterns, using block printing. Within our Art lessons, the children created their own title pages, inspired by the artwork and style of William Morris. Lastly, to complete our Power of Reading book 'Hidden Figures', the children enthusiastically researched the historical event of Apollo 11 and wrote their very own newspaper reports, using factual information and the features learnt previously.


