light why the pupil has been recognised and why we are immensely proud of them. Keep an eye on your letterboxes throughout the year for these special letters making their way to you.



Lottie: I have really enjoyed developing my Spanish vocabulary and working alongside different children from different year groups.



The numbers have been added up and sent off. Well done everyone who took part.




Children's Mental Health Awareness Week

We look forward to welcoming you into school then.

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
Measles and vaccinations
