Dear Parents,

At the start of the week, I was still searching for that lovely warm weather we had just a few weeks ago - it seemed to have vanished, leaving us with chilly mornings once again! But later in the week, my prayers were answered as the temperature soared, making the UK

hotter than Corfu and Ibiza! Standing on the gate that morning was suddenly a much more pleasant experience.

On Tuesday, we held our 11+ and Secondary Transfer Information Evening for our Year 5 parents. It always feels a little surreal to be discussing the process again just as we finalise places for our Year 6 pupils, but that is the rhythm of school life! We understand that sometimes this period can be an anxious time for families, but to remember that our focus is to support them every step of the way. From this point forward, we are dedicated to preparing our Year 5 pupils for the 11+ by offering additional support groups to develop and extend their skills. During this meeting, we were delighted to welcome Ms. McLellan, Head of St Dunstan's College Senior, to provide insights into the transition to secondary school. Rather than promoting her school specifically, she gave parents a valuable perspective on the entire 11+ journey. For those unfamiliar with the process, it can be overwhelming, and we hope that hearing from someone with hands-on experience helped to alleviate some concerns. On this note, you can now find the results for this year's Year 6 (2024-2025) on our website here, as well as the updated trends data.

Speaking of Ms. McLellan, Miss Rule and I had a fantastic follow-up meeting with her on Thursday when she spent the afternoon with us. We began exploring exciting ventures and collaborations, particularly for Year 5, as well as broader initiatives across the school. These discussions are particularly relevant this year, as a key benefit of the merger means that our Year 5 pupils now have the opportunity to secure a Year 7 place at St Dunstan's without undergoing the formal 11+ process. Pupils who meet the required standards are guaranteed a place, with the offer remaining

open until the end of the 11+ cycle in Year 6. We recognise that for some families, the 11+ can feel daunting, so this option provides valuable peace of mind. That said, we remain a Prep school, and we acknowledge that every child's journey is unique. While the early offer at St Dunstan's is an attractive option, we fully support all pupils in applying to the senior schools that best suit them. This approach gives us the best of both worlds - St Dunstan's aligns closely with our educational ethos, but our primary goal is to work with families to find the right school for each child.

This week also hosted our first Parents' Evening of the term and it was lovely to see parents in school on Thursday. These meetings are invaluable opportunities to discuss your child's progress, and while emails are always an option, there is nothing quite like a face-to-face conversation to foster meaningful discussions. Please remember that, while Parents' Evenings are scheduled events, our doors are always open should you wish to chat with us about anything at any time. Today, we were thrilled to host our Seat at Our Table event, inviting parents to sample the same healthy and delicious lunches our pupils enjoy every day. Parents clearly enjoyed the wide selection of nutritious food, and engaging warmly with our Year 6 pupils, sharing good conversation and company. I hope everyone who attended left with a sense of how lucky we are to have such fantastic catering. We're already looking forward to welcoming more parents to the event next week!

They tested for durability and water resistance, discovering which rocks could withstand pressure and which absorbed the most water. The children explored the area, identifying stones that could be used for roof tiles. pathways, and even statues, applying their newfound knowledge to the world around them. By testing soil samples and matching them to the mud found near the fridge, our young geologists cracked the case. Though the cake had already disappeared,
