After many years of serving our school community, we will be saying goodbye to SCAMPS at the end of this term. From September, we are thrilled to introduce Munchkin, our new and improved wraparound care offering.

Munchkin will run from 7:30am until 6:00pm, giving families greater flexibility and support, particularly for working parents. The extended hours are just one of the ways we're aiming to make daily life easier and more manageable for you.

This transition will also bring a more tailored approach to care. With increased space requirements and the need to cater for different age groups more specifically, we will be rethinking how we use our facilities. As a result, our afterschool clubs programme will be streamlined and restructured to allow for a more logical and effective use of space across the site.
