team. We are so excited for their next adventure but will look back fondly on our year together.




Year 1

<u>Celebrating Student Achievement</u> <u>at St. Christopher's The Hall – 2024-2025</u>

We are delighted to share some fantastic news about our pupils' academic progress this year. In line with our ongoing commitment to excellence in education, we have closely reviewed our school data to assess pupil growth across key subject areas — and the results are truly impressive.

Our latest analysis from our assessments show significant achievements in English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science:

- 84% of pupils made expected progress or exceeded expectations in **Mathematics**
- 82% of pupils made expected progress or exceeded expectations in **English**
- 84% of pupils made expected progress or exceeded expectations in **Reading**
- 77% of pupils made expected progress or exceeded expectations in **Science**

We are also extremely proud to announce that a significant number of our pupils have been assessed as **Working at Greater Depth**, based on teacher judgements. This means they are performing **well above the expected** **standard** for their age — a remarkable achievement that reflects both their deep understanding of the curriculum and their ability to apply knowledge with confidence and independence.

- 37% of children from Year 1 to Year 6 are Working in Greater Depth in **Maths**
- 37% of children from Year 1 to Year 6 are Working in Greater Depth in **Reading**
- 16% of children from Year 1 to Year 6 are Working in Greater Depth in **Writing**
- 28% of children from Year 1 to Year 6 are Working in Greater Depth in **Science**

These outcomes are a testament to the hard work and determination of our pupils, the unwavering dedication of our teaching staff, and the invaluable support of our parents.

Such strong progress across core subjects highlights the effectiveness of our educational approach and our shared commitment to helping every child thrive. As we look ahead to the new academic year, we remain focused on building upon this success and continuing to support each pupil on their learning journey.

Leavers




