Dear Parents.

What a wonderful first full week back at school it has been! The children have settled beautifully, and we are already into the rhythm of a busy and exciting term. I have thoroughly enjoyed getting started with my Year 6 English groups, as well as

spending time with our Preschool pupils where I will be reading them a story each week (I can already see this might be a highlight of my week!), and meeting Year 5 parents to discuss our links with St Dunstan's. One of the reasons I love my job so much is the variety each day brings, from storytime and lively lessons to parent meetings and creative planning, no two days are ever the same.

This week saw the launch of our Horizon Project afternoons, which this term are all about sustainability. Pupils have been introduced to what sustainability means in a practical, hands-on way. These sessions are deliberately designed to step away from screens and technology for a while, encouraging focus, problem-solving, and teamwork in the real world. Of course, we know technology and digital skills are vital for the future, but we also believe it's important to balance this with skills that risk being lost if children only ever learn through screens. It's not an either/or, we want to marry the two, giving our pupils the best of both worlds.

We have been delighted to have Mrs Eastwood join us as our new Director of Music, which she has begun with great aplomb! She has already thrown herself into life here, and together we are beginning a review of both our music curriculum and the wider opportunities available to pupils. In recognition of the current financial climate, we are pleased to share that we will be reducing the cost of instrumental lessons, in the hope that many more pupils will be able to take up learning an instrument. To help you get to know her and hear her vision, Mrs Eastwood hosted a short online meeting today. This has also been recorded so that, if you couldn't make it live, you can watch it at your convenience.

It was also lovely to see so many of you at our coffee morning today. These informal gatherings are such a valuable part of our school life, a chance to

come together, chat, and share as a community. Thank you to all who joined us. Looking ahead, a reminder that we have our remote parents' meetings next week on Tuesday and Thursday (I have finally got the dates right!). Links will be sent out to you early next week. Please log on a few minutes before your slot, as timings are tight for teachers. If you encounter any problems with connecting, just let us know by email. However, don't worry, these meetings are not formal academic reviews but a chance to touch base, put a name to a face, and ensure your child has settled happily into the new school year.

Across the wider St Dunstan's Educational Group, I am delighted to share that we have launched a new initiative bringing together all staff who lead subjects into cross-school professional learning clusters. These groups allow our teachers to share ideas, swap strategies, and discuss best practice across subjects. The real winners, of course, are our pupils: they benefit from a richer, more creative curriculum, as well as the energy and fresh ideas that come from teachers learning collaboratively. This is a truly exciting step forward and will only strengthen the excellent teaching already taking place in classrooms every day.

On the building front, while we have only just completed our new Year 5 classrooms and playground, I simply couldn't keep quiet any longer about what's coming next. The one part of the school that still makes me wince is the so-called "Horridor", the rather gloomy link between the Georgian House and the newer building. I'm thrilled to say that plans are already underway to transform this space into a bright, modern link that will truly bring the whole site up to standard. Although the project isn't due to start until the summer of 2026, our architects are already busy creating plans, and I couldn't wait to tell you about it. I look forward to sharing designs and imagery with you as soon as they are ready.

Finally, next week I will be away for three days at the annual Heads' Conference in Brighton. I hope to return with new ideas and inspiration, but in my absence, you will be in the very safe hands of my trusted deputy, Mrs West, who will also be writing to you next week.

some of the Malawi children travel to school. One of them runs to school for over 40 minutes. Another family shares a pair of shoes, so one child wears the left, and the other the right shoe; incredibly they

swap around each day! Charis was also here to thank the children for their donations at the end of the school year. St Christopher's children donated over 120 pairs of school shoes to the charity, which they have taken out to Malawi and given to the children. A fantastic way to support the charity and one which we will be repeating at the end of this academic year.


tivity as everyone settles into new routines, class-rooms and teachers.
