Pre-Prep

It's been just a few weeks since our brand-new Pre-Prep playground opened - and already, it's become a favourite space for our youngest learners. Watching the children explore, play, and thrive in this amazing environment has been a joy. Designed with both fun and development in mind, the playground is proving to be far more than just a place to let off steam. Every area is being used in meaningful ways, helping to nurture key skills and inspire imaginative play.

The trim trail has become a hub of activity, with children gaining confidence and physical strength as they challenge themselves on the various equipment. Balance, coordination, and resilience are all being put into practice — often with huge smiles and lots of laughter. The climbing hill and tunnel have sparked endless imaginative games, from mountaineering adventures to secret hideouts, while the musical area has given children the chance to explore rhythm, sound, and creative expression. It's been wonderful to see children working together to make music whether planned or spontaneous. The new artificial grass has transformed the space into a safe, soft, and all-weather surface, perfect for running, games, and relaxed group play. 


Music


