We kicked things off on Wednesday with a whole-school assembly, where Ms Wooderson and Ms Williams shared the stories of

inspirational figures from the Arts. It was the perfect launch to get us thinking about creativity, courage, and the power of expression.

Over the next two weeks, lunchtimes will be a treat for the senses: a menu packed with diverse and culturally rich dishes, accompanied by music to set the mood. Because sometimes, the

Laura has recorded a special message for our pupils, sharing how her heritage and experiences inspired her writing. Music will fill the air daily as we explore the influence of Black musicians across time, from jazz and reggae to hip hop and Afrobeat. Each year group will also be celebrating both a historic figure and a modern role model, discovering how individuals, past and present, change the world in different ways. And to bring it all together, we're creating a whole-school 'Walk Through Time' in our corridors: a timeline of influential Black figures from the past, present, and Headteacher

future. After half term, the children will tour the display to see how all their learning has come to life. Black History Month isn't just about looking back; it's about celebrating voices, stories, and achievements that continue to inspire the future. We can't wait to share this journey with the children, and with you!




