Dear Parents.

cessible and accommodating experience for all. Blending in-person and virtual meetings is something we will continue to refine, but we are very pleased that this step forward helped ensure every parent could have the conversation they needed.

This week also saw a very important moment in our school calendar: the Year 6 Charity Assembly. Each year, our Year 6 pupils research and present charities they believe the school should support over the coming year. Often, these charities have a personal significance for them, and the thought, sensitivity, and passion they bring to the project is truly inspiring. On Thursday, our three finalist groups presented to the whole school before the children voted.

All the charities put forward were worthy causes, and we hope the process has helped our pupils reflect deeply on what it means to support others and to give generously of time, care, and thought.

With the tree sparkling, the music flowing, and the spirit of giving firmly rooted in our community, it truly feels as though the festive season is well underway.

We are grateful to Miss Cheetham and Mr Elkouby for giving Year 6 such a motivating and memorable experience, and we look forward to putting some of their ideas into action!
